Anderson City Council Minutes, Continued:

Reports Denali Borough Mayor Clay Walker reported that he had brought the letter of non objection regarding the placement of sludge in the Anderson Lagoon with the understanding the city would not add material within the setback and requesting surveys illustrating the placement of sludge. Mayor Walker referred to his email provided to the council and shared he had attended the Alaska Municipal League Conference in Juneau last month and he had met with Legislators. Mayor Walkers report is available in the City Office upon request. The Assembly will be touring Clear AFB in May. No trip to the Park this year.

Tricia Turley requested the check for the Library which the Council had approved in this year's budget. Mrs. Turley also requested four thousand dollars be set aside for the Library when we submit the city's request to the borough for revenue sharing. Mrs. Turley reported all students attended the Science Fair and three students are going on to Fairbanks Interior Science Fair. Dan Pulta is new superintendent starts July first.

Departmental Reports Park: Jeff Taylor reported he is over budget because of advertisement and would like to cut back. Jeff Taylor reported he heard from the Machine gunners.

Environmental: Carl Leake reported that Scott and Reed had worked on C, H and Second Streets which were frozen. He had to call Big Foot late Friday night because the Jetter broke. Carl Leake reported that Scott Thompson went to Wasilla to work on the impeller from the pump at lift station. Carl Leake stressed not to flush anything other than toilet paper. Mayor Thompson reported that the City Council met with the Engineer last week and the engineer stated "do not accept as is." Mayor Thompson is consulting the attorney.

Land; Mayor Thompson reported that Scott Thompson dealt with contractors on fees for gravel.

Public Safety; Rupert Smith reported we still need Volunteers. Rupert Smith reported EMT members will be attending a continuing education symposium in Fairbanks this month. Rupert Smith reported that the Call out system is in testing stage.

Public Works: Carl Leake reported that Scott Thompson would be doing snow removal.
